NEW FACULTY RECRUITED



Dr. Vivian Shi, M.D., FAAD, joined the UAMS Department of Dermatology as an Associate Professor in July of 2020. Dr. Shi received her undergraduate degree in physiological sciences from UCLA, and subsequently spent a year performing research on gene regulation in pathogenic bacteria in the department of microbiology at UCLA. She earned her M.D. degree from the University of Illinois at Chicago, during which she completed a fellowship in the Skin Immunology Laboratory. She was an integral part of the team characterizing the pathophysiology of atopic dermatitis.

Dr. Shi completed her internship in Internal Medicine at the University of Chicago—North Shore Health System, followed by dermatology residency at the University of California, Davis.

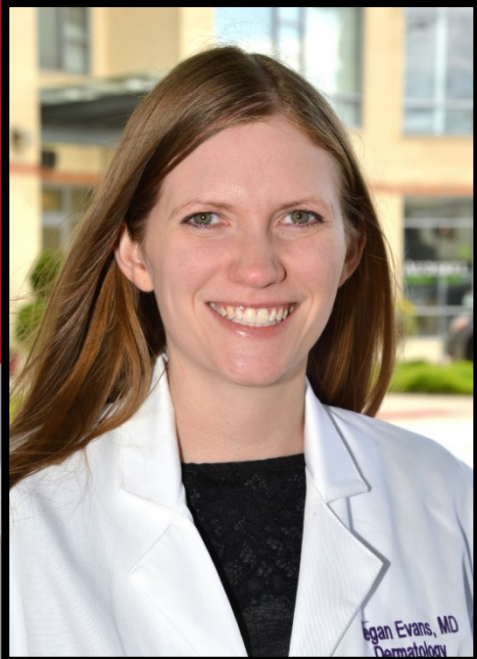
Prior to her tenure at UAMS, Dr. Shi was the Director of Dermatology Clinical Trials, Director of the Inflammatory Skin Research Fellowship Program, and Director of both the Eczema Specialty Clinic and the Hidradenitis Suppurativa Specialty Clinic at the University of Arizona Banner Medical Center in Tucson, Arizona. Dr. Shi's research and clinical interests include complex inflammatory skin conditions (such as atopic dermatitis, hidradenitis suppurativa, and psoriasis), skin barrier repair, transepidermal drug delivery, and integrative dermatology.

Dr. Shi has served as the principal investigator for numerous industry-sponsored and investigator-initiated clinical and translational studies. She has published over 100 peer-reviewed articles and is the editor for two reference dermatology textbooks on atopic dermatitis and hidradenitis suppurativa. Dr. Shi is a recipient of the Patient-Centered Investigation Award from the Dermatology Foundation and is a member of the International Eczema Council.

NEW FACULTY RECRUITED



Dr. Rodrigo Valdes-Rodriguez earned his M.D. at the Universidad Autónoma de Coahuila in Mexico, after which he completed a dermatology residency at the Universidad Autónoma de San Luis Potosí. He went on to complete a second dermatology residency at Temple University's Lewis Katz School of Medicine in Philadelphia, PA, followed by a fellowship in dermatopathology at the University of Virginia. Dr. Valdes will join our faculty in September of 2020.



Dr. Megan Evans completed her M.D. and residency in dermatology at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. She went on to complete a fellowship in pediatric dermatology at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She will join the dermatology faculty at Arkansas Children's Hospital this August.

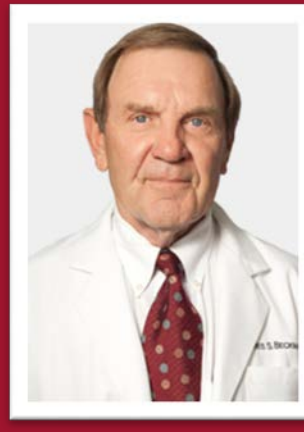

It is hard to believe we are more than three months into possibly the biggest public health challenge of our medical careers. From initial fears and doubts, to total shutdown, and then returning back to normalcy, albeit under new guidelines, we have been witness to many changes at UAMS in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. One of the major efforts of the UAMS response has been establishing testing for the residents of Arkansas, both in a permanent drive-through clinic on campus and mobile triage sites throughout the state. I had the opportunity to be a part of these efforts in March and April, and it has profoundly impacted my medical training in ways I've never expected.

It was a great experience to witness leadership at UAMS truly start a clinical operation from the ground up. When I started volunteering at the Drive-Through Screening, it was a very basic operation with limited supplies and limited ability for testing. In fact the viral culture swabs from our very own Dermatology Clinic held us over when we ran out of supplies in the early days. Over the next 6 weeks, our testing and interface with the patients seemed to evolve daily. With the help of redeployed staff, the amazing leadership of Dr. Jennifer Hunt, and members of the National Guard, a truly...*(continued on next page)*

...remarkable operation was created with the help of attendings, fellows and residents volunteering their time from all departments at UAMS. The Infectious Disease team was a constant support guiding our medical decisions and algorithms.

There were many memorable encounters—emergency situations, tricky confrontations, emotional patients, both scared for their health and grateful for the service provided by UAMS to the community. I traveled to lovely small towns that were welcoming and generous hosts for us to provide testing for their residents. During the course of those six weeks, I screened nearly a thousand patients, including countless first responders, corrections officers, and health care workers. I witnessed some of our first positive cases in Arkansas recover and come back to UAMS to donate their plasma to help others. UAMS went from testing results taking over five days to return, to a less than 24-hour turnaround time with remarkably sensitive in-house testing. While the pandemic is nowhere close to being behind us, I am confident UAMS is well equipped to serve our patients with the help of everyone working together.

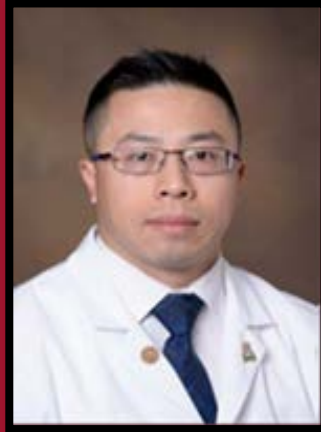
