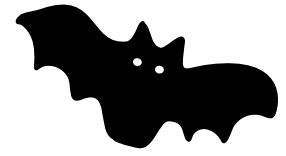


HALLOWEEN SAFETY AND INCLUSION TIPS



While Halloween can be an exciting and festive time at school, it is important to keep in mind a few simple tips that help promote both safety and inclusion for all students.



Ensure costumes allow for safe visibility.

Students should be able to see clearly without their vision being blocked or impaired.



Discourage props or accessories that create hazards.

Items that could cause tripping or accidental harm should be avoided.



Prohibit costumes with realistic-looking weapons.

These can cause confusion, alarm, or potential safety concerns.



Promote cultural sensitivity in costume choices.

Encourage creativity that is respectful and avoid costumes that could offend or reinforce stereotypes.



Encourage kindness and respect for all costumes.

Remind students that Halloween is meant to be fun for everyone, regardless of costume style.



Provide support for students without costume access.

Schools can offer low-cost options or seek donations so every student feels included.



Keep costume parades non-competitive.

A focus on participation rather than prizes helps create a more inclusive and positive experience.



Be mindful of food allergies when providing candy.

Choose allergy-friendly options or offer non-food treats so all students can safely participate.
