**Purpose:** To outline the procedure for extramural experiences (away rotations).

**Policy:** This COM Internal Medicine program policy outlines the criteria for resident’s participation in extramural rotations, required and elective. This policy outlines how residents will be evaluated while on an extramural rotation and how the level of supervision for the resident will be determined for the rotation. This policy outlines funding for resident’s stipend and benefits while on an extramural rotation and the process for approval of any extramural rotation request.

The Internal Medicine Residency program does not offer any extramural rotations. Within the UAMS and VA systems, all Internal Medicine residents rotate in inpatient care teams, ambulatory clinics, critical care teams, night float rotations, and have exposure to numerous specialty rotation within Internal Medicine. All funding for Internal Medicine residents comes from UAMS or the VA.

Per the UAMS College of Medicine Graduate Medical Educational Committee Policy on extramural rotations, if the UAMS Internal Medicine program is unable to provide a clinical experience as outlined under the ACGME Internal Medicine program requirements, residents may request an extramural required rotation through the online form below.
