







Dr. Edgardo "Eddie" Angtuaco February 22, 1949 - May 28, 2018

The UAMS Department of Radiology hosted its 3rd Annual CME & Dinner event on 24th August 2019. The event was held in memory of Dr. Edgardo "Eddie" Angtuaco, who passed away in May 2018. Dr. Eddie was the professor of radiology, neurosurgery and neurology and chief of neuroradiology at UAMS from 1987-2018. The day started with a free CME session focused on neuroradiology and stroke, featuring the keynote speaker Dr. Mauricio Castillo, Chief Neuroradiology at the University of North Carolina, who also served as the inaugural speaker for the Edgardo J. Angtuaco, M.D. Education Endowment in Neuroradiology. Other speakers from UAMS were Dr. Sanjeeva Onteddu, director of stroke program and Dr. Kamran Mudassar, interventional neuroradiologist. Samant, staff neuroradiologist gave a talk on behalf of UAMS radiology alumnus, Dr. Jennifer McCarty who is presently at University of Texas at Houston who was unable to come.

Dr. Amanda Lackey, breast radiologist in Springfield, MO and also a UAMS radiology alumnus gave the final talk of the conference. The CME program was attended by physicians, medical students, nurses and technologists. The event culminated with an evening dinner at Chenal Country Club, where former colleagues and trainees of Dr. Eddie shared their memories in an open microphone session. Also in attendance at the dinner were members of Dr. Eddie's family.
