As Arkansas's only academic medical center, UAMS serves as the state's sole liver and kidney transplant center, only Level 1 Trauma Center, and a regional hub for stroke intervention, neurosurgery, oncology, and advanced specialty care. This unique environment provides Interventional Radiologists with exposure to a diverse and highly rewarding case mix while supporting meaningful academic and clinical career development.

The Division of Interventional Radiology performs more than **9,000 procedures annually** and continues to expand its clinical footprint throughout Arkansas and the surrounding region.

Highlights of the practice include:

- High-volume, comprehensive Interventional Radiology service
- Complex transplant, trauma, oncology, vascular, and stroke-related interventions
- Dedicated outpatient clinic with protected clinic time
- Established office-based laboratory (OBL) practice
- Strong multidisciplinary collaboration with surgical, oncology, transplant, and neuroscience teams
- Academic appointment with opportunities for teaching, mentorship, and scholarly activity

State-of-the-Art Facilities

Following a major departmental renovation completed in 2025–2026, UAMS Interventional Radiology offers some of the most advanced procedural technology available, including:

- Two Canon Alphenix Sky+ ceiling-mounted angiography suites
- Canon Alphenix 4D CT combined CT/Angiography system
- Dedicated Canon procedural CT suite
- Siemens ARTIS Q angiography system at the office-based laboratory
- Dedicated procedural CT capabilities at the OBL

These investments support a wide range of advanced image-guided procedures and position the division for continued growth and innovation.

Collaborative Team Environment

The Division currently consists of:

- Five full-time Interventional Radiology faculty
- Four Advanced Practice Providers
- Dedicated clinical and procedural support staff

Faculty members benefit from a collegial team environment with shared responsibilities and a manageable call schedule.

Call Structure

- Call coverage shared between UAMS and the adjoining Central Arkansas Veterans Healthcare System
- Call taken one week at a time (Friday–Thursday)
- Average call frequency: approximately once every seven weeks

Practice Structure

- One dedicated outpatient clinic day each week
- Regular participation in the division's office-based laboratory
- Balanced mix of inpatient, outpatient, and procedural responsibilities

UAMS maintains a strong commitment to education and physician training.

 - An ACGME-accredited Diagnostic Radiology Residency followed by an accredited Independent Interventional Radiology Residency
