Message from the Dean

Dear College of Medicine Community,

The last several months have been difficult for our shared lives together. While the deaths of our colleagues are very public losses that we grieve together, there are private individual losses that have occurred almost daily in the families of members of our community. We share grief for all of these tragic losses.

Grief is difficult for everyone. Grief affects us all differently. Some of us are relatively public about our experience of grief and others are very private. However one experiences grief, please keep a few things in mind.

Grief is a normal biological process that is as old as humankind. Grief also occurs in other mammalian species. Thus, it unlikely that any of us can avoid grief, nor is avoiding grief desirable – no matter how hard it may feel at the moment.

Community, when it is available, helps us through grief. The shared experience of grief normalizes the process and helps us to not feel so alone. Public rituals such as funerals or memorial services are for a reason: to help those left behind with their grief.

Grief occurs in waves. The intense feelings of loss, despair, anger and sadness come and go, usually for at least a year – and often longer – for a significant loss such as a parent, spouse, child, etc.

Finally, being gentle with oneself and others by allowing grief to happen on its own time schedule is a good and helpful approach. Just like most human processes, grief happens when and how it can. Please support each other through these difficult times.


