During Practice of Medicine (POM) courses in the M1 and M2 year, all students must take the Objective Structured Clinical Examinations (OSCE). In general, these tests include several stations at which the student interacts with a standardized patient to perform a history and physical exam relevant to a chief complaint in a specified amount of time. Detailed information about the OSCE is included in the syllabus for the courses. **A student must have a passing grade on the End of Year OSCE in POM 2 in order to advance to the junior year.**

If the student has not met this requirement by the end of the first twelve weeks of the junior year, the student must go before the Promotions Committee to determine appropriate action.
