STATEWIDE MENTAL HEALTH INITIATIVE In an effort to increase mental health services for Arkansans, especially in rural parts of the state, the Arkansas Department of Human Services (DHS) and UAMS announced an \$9.5 million, five-year mental health grant program. "Mental illnesses are managed predominantly by primary care clinicians," said **Shashank Kraleti, M.D.**, Chair of the Department of **Family and Preventative Medicine.** "This grant will bolster the work that UAMS has been doing in integrating behavioral health personnel into all our primary care clinics, which provide much needed access to comprehensive care to the communities in the state." <u>READ MORE</u>




Dr. Joseph Bates

Joseph Bates, M.D., M.S., a 1957 alumnus who served on the College of Medicine faculty and at the VA for over three decades, including 21 years as Vice Chair of **Internal Medicine**, died Sept. 29. Dr. Bates went on to make remarkable contributions as a leader at the Arkansas Department of Health and in the UAMS College of Public Health over the next 25 years.

Dr. Bates joined the COM faculty in 1963. He was Chief of the Pulmonary Disease Section at the McClellan Veterans Medical Center from 1965 until his appointment as Chief of the Medical Service at the VA in 1968. Over the next 30 years, Dr. Bates taught and mentored medical students, residents and fellows, earning deep respect for his commitment to superb patient care and his notoriously high expectations for aspiring physicians.

Dr. Bates maintained a successful research program and was internationally known for making breakthroughs in the understanding of the transmission of tuberculosis and for his work in the development of community-based treatment of TB, which helped patients stay out of sanitoriums. <u>READ MORE</u>

Mark O'Brien, M.D., a nationally known pediatric neurosurgeon and faculty member in the Department of **Neurosurgery** in 2005-2015, died Oct. 20. Dr. O'Brien practiced at Arkansas Children's and served as Chief of Pediatric Neurosurgery. Following his retirement iin 2015, he continued to participate in conferences and serve on the resident interview committee. A memorial service will be held at 11:00 a.m. Friday, Oct. 27, at Christ Episcopal Church, 509 Scott Street, Little Rock. <u>READ MORE</u>
