FOREVER CHEMICALS & DEVELOPMENT | The National Institutes of Health has awarded Arkansas Children's Research Institute a \$3 million grant to explore how polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), also known as "forever chemicals," impact infant and child development. The project will also look at whether a pregnant mom's physical activity can offer some protection against the effects of PFAS. The work is led by Aline Andres, Ph.D., RD, Professor in the Department of Pediatrics and Associate Director of the Arkansas Children's Nutrition Center. <u>READ MORE</u>

Howard Herschel Conaway, Ph.D.

Howard Herschel Conaway, Ph.D., a faculty member for more than 50 years in what is now the Department of Physiology and Cell Biology, died Dec. 28. An award-winning educator, Dr. Conaway taught in the M1 Medical Physiology course for 42 years and went on to serve as Course Director of the M2 Endocrine/Reproduction Module from 2013 until his retirement in 2021. He published extensively throughout his career, with a research focus on defining physiological agents that stimulate osteoclasts and bone resorption. <u>READ MORE</u>
